- college's admission requirements: GPA in college
- The minimum GPA requirement to get into Georgia State University is a 2.8
- If submitting ACT, the writing section is required

High School Requirements

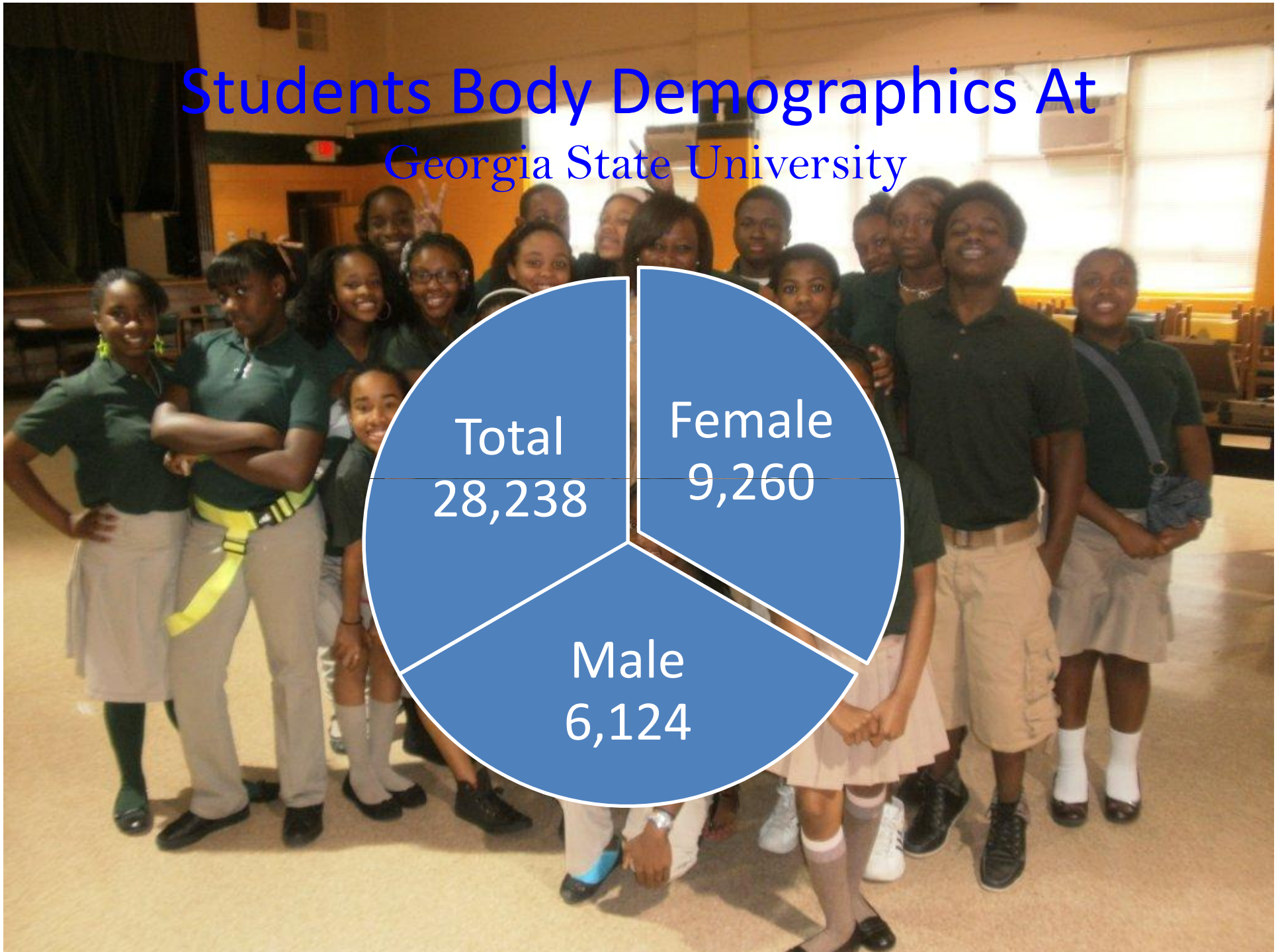
- The average ranges for admissible freshmen are as follows: High School Core GPA 3.2 – 3.

History

- **Georgia State University** offers 52 degrees in 250 fields of study with more than 1,000 faculty members. The university president is Mark P. Becker. The Robinson College of Business has more than 50,000 graduates. Tens of thousands have gone on to become business leaders, like these who did so nationally: Ken Lewis, Bank of America Chairman; Richard Lenny, former Hershey Foods; Jim Copeland, retired Deloitte & Touché; Bill Dahlberg, Southern Company former Chairman ; J. Veronica Baggins, Hedrick & Struggles senior partner; and Michael Gear on, Jr. a part owner of the Atlanta Hawks, Thrashers and Philips Arena. Georgia State's campus occupies 34 acres (140,000 m²) of downtown Atlanta with 40 buildings. Future construction is on the drawing boards with numerous new projects. A multi-million dollar Science Park with laboratories and classrooms recently opened next to the Sports Arena.
