

Patterns of Growth and Development



- Growth and development occur in a series of patterns called sequential steps
 - For example, to learn to eat with a spoon, a child must already know how to grasp


Patterns of Growth and Development

- Growth and development rates vary from child to child
- Individual rates of growth mean that children grow and develop at different rates based on heredity, environment, and motivation
- Interrelated development rates are interactions between physical, emotional, social, and intellectual aspects of growth
