

## **Understanding Career Planning**



A *job* is whatever you do to earn a living
A *career* is a series of jobs you perform over a period of years
It is much broader

than a job

- Your *aptitudes* are your natural talents and your potential for learning
- Your *abilities* are your powers to perform


#### **Your Interests**

- What is your favorite class in school? Why?

### **Your Aptitudes**

Aptitude tests can help you identify your strengths
 The results will indicate

- the careers in which you will have the best chances for success
- The test will not give you absolute answers to your career questions



### **Your Abilities**

- Abilities are developed through practice and training
- Abilities can be physical or mental
- It is easier to develop an ability if you also have an aptitude and an interest

#### **Your Education Choices**

- Career preparation during high school
  - cooperative education
  - apprenticeships
  - Tech prep
  - internships

- Career preparation after high school
  - military
  - volunteering
  - professional schools
  - community colleges
  - college or university

- Job shadowing is a program to explore career options through a student's one-day visit with an experienced person to his or her job
- Work-based
   *learning programs* combine classroom
   instruction with on the-job experience





**Cooperative education** prepares students for an occupation immediately after high school through a paid job experience Apprenticeship programs provide training for a skilled trade

- Tech prep, or the technical preparation education program, combines two years of high school courses with two years of postsecondary education
- An *internship* is a paid or unpaid work experience to learn about a job or industry

A mentor is a person who knows how to do the job and teaches the student to do the job well

Career preparation after high school includes
 *professional schools*, which offer training in a specialized field
 *community colleges*, which offer skills

training or comprehensive programs

college or university programs, which offer four-year degree programs


## Other Factors Affecting Your Career Choice

- After you have considered interests, aptitudes, abilities, and educational requirements, you will also need to consider
  - your lifestyle
  - potential income
  - working conditions

## Your Lifestyle

Where do you want to live? How close is that area to your job?

- How will working hours affect your family life?
- How much leisure time will you have?



#### **Potential Income**

- How much income do you want to earn?
- How much income can you expect to earn?
- Will spending money provide for personal and family needs?
- What is the income potential of this career?

## Working Conditions

- Are there environmental conditions to which you would object?
- Would you like the same type of responsibilities every day or a variety of tasks?
- Do you prefer independence or team interaction?
- Do you work well under pressure?

#### Making a Career Decision

- A career plan is a list of steps to follow to achieve a career goal
- Each step of the career plan includes
  - job experience
  - education and training
  - extracurricular activities


